Commonage Registration Guidelines & Required documentation:

Required documents:

A copy of valid Passport; Birth Certificate; National Insurance Card

Eligibility:

Any male or female above the age of eighteen who is a biological descendent of Harbour Island may register as a commoner.

Process A-E:

- a. Once registered as a commoner, notice of registration will be issued.
- b. In the event of a rejected application, applicants have the right to appeal to a stipendiary and circuit magistrate. The application process may be repeated after an interval of one year.
- c. The successful applicant shall be eligible for property consideration in the commonage according to guidelines stipulated in The Commonage Grant of July 1st, 1842.

Financial Responsibility: \$125.25

- Non-refundable process fee: \$5.25
- Due on approval of Application: \$120

Note:

ALL COMMONERS ARE REQUIRED TO FAMILIARIZE THEMSELVES WITH COMMONAGE GRANT, ACT AND BYLAWS AND SHALL BE SUBJECT THERETO.
